	The analytical end-point are findings on the processing of a moral category such as child welfare in a specific institutional field. This field is conceived as a geography of knowledges (Santos) and norms (cf. research on legal pluralism). In child welfare-related interactions on the ground, organizational, legal, professional and quotidian norms meet conflictually. The analysis scrutinizes the current performance of material rationality in social interventions under conditions of hybrid governance system and with a heterogenous population of users.
Three processes in restructuring + crisis (Erase non relevant ones) • rationalization/management reforms (NPM, others) • Horizontal subsidiarity (involvement of/outsourcing to other suppliers)	Short description
	Key (re)structuring forces are: NPM as a background to the overall regulatory scheme; furthermore orientations towards child protection and the implementation of standardized tools in assessments; finally, complex relationships between co-actors involved in the governance process as well as in interactions with families.
