They deliver a wide range of services to a variety of social groups, namely older people, children and people with disabilities.
Category of case study ('what' is investigated) • Actor(s)	Taking a sample of private social welfare organizations coming from the different regions of mainland Portugal and providing the different types of services typical of this kind of organizations, the study will focus on how they have been coping with the changes in demand and in the public policies related to the services they provide.
Time frame considered	2008 - 2012
Five 'perspectives'  • Governance	The study will focus on how the private social welfare have been responding to the changes in their social and economic context in terms of their internal organizations and interactions with key stakeholders
<ul> <li>Three processes in restructuring + crisis</li> <li>Cuts/rationalization/management reforms (NPM, others)</li> <li>Vertical subsidiarity (administrative rearrangements between government levels)</li> <li>Horizontal subsidiarity (involvement of/outsourcing to other suppliers)</li> </ul>	The way private social welfare organizations are responding to changes in their social and economic environment include both changes in their internal organization, but also their interactions with other key stakeholders, private and public, (at the same level of work and at wider, or lower scales of intervention).
