Specific questions/focus	In developing countries, microcredits have been used for decades to combat poverty trough the access to small loans. This idea has been "translated" into developed countries, in particular into the European Union, but not literally, as generally programmes support self-employment and microentreprises of those not among the poorest. A programme in Spain is trying to restore the original sense of microcredit addressing the initiative to those really deprived.
	This experience is interesting for the Action as the restructuring of social services could require the use of new tools. Moreover, it involves a public/private partnership, which is another feature deserving attention in the crisis scenario.
